Magnemite (マグネイト) Amigurumi Pattern

I'm so excited to share a brand-new pattern with you all for one of the very first Electric and steel-type Pokémon: Magnemite! It was requested by a friend of mine. I love its simple design and I was motivated to tackle the challenge of patterning the magnets on each end the body. I'm super pleased with how it all came together and I hope you are, too!

Pattern Notes

Most components of this pattern are worked in the round. Some of the rounds will be crocheted in back loops only, or in both loops. If it is not explicitly stated in the pattern, crochet in both loops.

Materials

4.00 mm crochet hook (or smaller, if desired)
Medium (4) Light Grey yarn (I used Red Heart Super Saver in LIGHT GREY)
Medium (4) Shale yarn (I used Impeccable Yarn in PALE GREY)
Medium (4) White yarn (I used Impeccable Yarn in WHITE)
Medium (4) Dusty Blue yarn (I used Impeccable Yarn in BLUE MOON)
Medium (4) Cherry yarn (I used Impeccable Yarn in CHERRY)
Cardboard for reinforcing the screw & magnet bases
Tapestry needle for sewing pieces together
Polyfill for stuffing

Terminology

This pattern is written using US terminology.

Body

With Shale yarn,

- 1 ~~MC, sc 6 (6)~~
- 2 ~~inc x 6 (12)~~
- 3 ~~sc, inc x 6 (18)~~
- 4 ~~2 sc, inc x 6 (24)~~
- 5 ~~3 sc, inc x 6 (30)~~
- 6 ~~4 sc, inc x 6 (36)~~
- 7 ~~5 sc, inc x 6 (42)~~
- 8 ~~6 sc, inc x 6 (48)~~
- 9 ~~7 sc, inc x 6 (54)~~
- 10 ~~8 sc, inc x 6 (60)~~
- 11 ~~9 sc, inc x 6 (66)~~
- 12 ~~10 sc, inc x 6 (72)~~
- 13 ~~11 sc, inc x 6 (78)~~
- 14-27 sc around for 14 rounds (78)
- 28 11 sc, dec x 6 (72)
- 29 10 sc, dec x 6 (66)
- 30 9 sc, dec x 6 (60)
- 31 8 sc, dec x 6 (54)
- 32 7 sc, dec x 6 (48)
- 33 6 sc, dec x 6 (42)
- 34 5 sc, dec x 6 (36)

• Magnemite's body should be made in
• with a slightly paler grey than the screws
• and magnets.

• Please note that round 1 of the body
• (MC, sc 6) will be the top of Magnemite's
• head, NOT the front of its face.



FO, closing the up the shape and hiding the yarn tail inside of the body.

Magnet (make 2)

- Crochet and join piece #1 and #2 in the order indicated in the pattern. This will hide the colour changes between yarns on Magnemite's backside.




Piece #1

With Cherry yarn,

- 1 ch 5, TURN
- 2 3 sc, 3 sc into the same stitch, then continuing in the round, 3 sc, 3 sc into the same stitch, slst (12)

Working in the round,

- 3 3 sc, 3 sc into the same stitch, sc, 3 sc into the same stitch, 3 sc, 3 sc into the same stitch ,sc, 3 sc into the same stitch (20)
 - 4 in back loops only, sc around (20)
 - 5 in both loops, 4 sc, dec, 2 sc, dec, 4 sc, dec, 2 sc, dec (16)
- Then, insert a rectangular piece of cardboard to reinforce the base. -
- 6-9 sc around for 4 rounds (16)
- Change to Light Grey yarn. -
- 10-16 sc around for 7 rounds (16)
- FO, hiding the yarn tail inside of the shape.



- Your cardboard pieces should fit snugly into the base of the magnets. It will maintain a flat edge in your magnets.

- Prepare a total of 4 rectangular pieces.

Piece #2

With Dusty Blue yarn,

1 ch 5, TURN

2 3 sc, 3 sc into the same stitch, then continuing in the round, 3 sc, 3 sc into the same stitch, slst (12)

Working in the round,

3 3 sc, 3 sc into the same stitch, sc, 3 sc into the same stitch, 3 sc, 3 sc into the same stitch, sc, 3 sc into the same stitch (20)

4 in back loops only, sc around (20)

5 in both loops, 4 sc, dec, 2 sc, dec, 4 sc, dec, 2 sc, dec (16)

- Then, insert a rectangular piece of cardboard to reinforce the base. -

6-9 sc around for 4 rounds (16)

- Change to Light Grey yarn. -

10-16 sc around for 7 rounds (16)

17 sc, 5 ch, and insert your hook into the 8th stitch of piece #1 and sc.
THEN, 41 sc (42)

When crossing the chain, go under one loop for each side so that there are two distinct paths of stitches



sc, ch 5. THEN, insert your hook into the 8th stitch of piece #1 and sc.



Place a stitch marker into this sc to mark the new beginning of round 17. THEN, 41 sc.

18 16 sc, dec, sc, dec, 16 sc, dec, sc, dec (38)

19 sc around (38)

20 6 sc, 3 dec, 12 sc, 3 dec, 8 sc (32)

21 sc around (32)

22 6 sc, 2 dec, 5 sc, dec, 5 sc, 2 dec, 4 sc, dec (26)

23 sc around (26)

24 3 sc, dec, 4 sc, dec, 5 sc, dec, 4 sc, dec, 2 sc (22)

25 sc around (22)

slst and FO, leaving a yarn tail for sewing.

Eye

With white yarn,

- 1 MC, sc 5 (5)
- 2 inc x 5 (10)
- 3 sc, inc x 5 (15)
- 4 2 sc, inc x 5 (20)
- 5 3 sc, inc x 5 (25)
- 6 4 sc, inc x 5 (30)
- 7 5 sc, inc x 5 (35)
- 8 6 sc, inc x 5 (40)

slst and FO, leaving a yarn tail for sewing.

Top Screw (Make 1)

With light grey yarn,

- 1 MC, sc 6 (6)
- 2 inc x 6 (12)
- 3 sc, inc x 6 (18)
- 4 2 sc, inc x 6 (24)
- 5 3 sc, inc x 6 (30)
- 6 4 sc, inc x 6 (36)
- 7 5 sc, inc x 6 (42)
- 8-9 sc around for 2 rounds (42)
- 10 *in back loops only*, sc around (42)
- 11 *in both loops*, 5 sc, dec x 6 (36)

- Lightly stuff the top of the screw. Then, add a piece of cardboard to reinforce the base. -

- 12 4 sc, dec x 6 (30)
- 13 3 sc, dec x 6 (24)
- 14 2 sc, dec x 6 (18)
- 15 *in front loops only*, sc around (18)
- 16 *in both loops*, sc around (18)
- 17 *in back loops only*, sc around (18)
- 18 *in both loops*, sc around (18)
- 19 *in back loops only*, sc around (18)
- 20 *in both loops*, sc around (18)
- 21 *in back loops only*, sc around (18)
- 22 *in both loops*, sc around (18)

slst and FO, leaving a yarn tail for sewing.



- It is easiest to insert the cardboard
- circle halfway through round 11.

Bottom Screws (Make 2)

With light grey yarn,

- 1 MC, sc 6 (6)
- 2 inc x 6 (12)
- 3 sc, inc x 6 (18)
- 4 2 sc, inc x 6 (24)
- 5 sc around (24)
- 6 *in back loops only*, sc around (24)
- 7 *in both loops*, 2 sc, dec x 6 (18)

- Lightly stuff the top of the screw. Then, add a piece of cardboard to reinforce the base. -

- 8 sc, dec x 6 (12)
- 9 *in front loops only*, sc around (12)
- 10 *in both loops*, sc around (12)
- 11 *in back loops only*, sc around (12)
- 12 *in both loops*, sc around (12)
- 13 *in back loops only*, sc around (12)

slst and FO, leaving a yarn tail for sewing.



Finishing touches & tips



Use pins to mark each stitch you'll be working into when sewing on each limb (i.e., if there are 18 stitches in the last round of your limb, you should place 18 pins into your work). This is especially important for sewing on the eye.

Pre-planning will help ensure a clean-looking finished product!



Sewing on the eye properly will lead to a polished finished product. After sewing, Needle felt along the edges to smooth out sharp edges and minor imperfections.

The order in which you sew on the limbs can help to improve the symmetry of your finished product. Here is the order in which I sewed on each detail:

Order	Limbs/Details attached
1	Top screw
2	Eye
3	Bottom screws
4	Magnets
